Re: USA vs. 515 Concord Ave (Robert Clarkson), Docket # 8:07-cr-0536

Dear Agent Andy:

On August 10, 2007 the US District Court in Greenville, SC handed down a court order ordering you to return to me all the documents and material seized from my house during your raid on May 3, 2007 that did not pertain to a criminal investigation. You have not returned to me many items and you have not obeyed the court order.

You still have in your possession much of my property, none of which has any bearing or valid use in your criminal investigation. For example, you seized cash money in the amount \$1,000 as you itemized and \$3,000 according to my records. Your agency policy is to place cash money into a temporary bank account. Later, you can just write a check to move the funds.

My cash money was therefore commingled with the other cash in the bank and is no longer indistinguishable. I can see the initial seizure of the cash to test it for counterfeit and check out the serial number, however, the commingled money in the bank cannot be used as evidence or aid in your investigation. You have no reason to withhold the funds of this political association.

You did not return \$3500 in checks and money orders including my disability check from the Veterans Administration. How could these be an aid to your investigation? Do you think I forged a VA disability check or that somebody there has been sending it to me illegally for decades?

You have numerous other items that fit very well into the parameters of the court order. Your crew is definitely in violation of a clearly written Order. Further, the highly paid expert at the most prestigious law enforcement agency in the world, wasted a great deal of time for absolutely nothing. Before you filed an affidavit in the federal court in Greenville, your people had already made a determination that my Patriot Club was not connected to the other patriot group in Asheville.

Because you expended over a million dollars on an investigation of nothing, serious criminals and interstate automobile thieves are now terrorizing the good citizens of Asheville, North Carolina.

Items seized and not returned include:

1. My law school diploma
2. Coin collection (penny & nickel)
3. Approximately 200 generic silver rounds and at least 1 gold coin.
4. My collection of defaulted paper currencies and repudiated government bonds
5. Cartoons and other exhibits for my silver & gold class
6. Blue index cards with contact information of the Patriots for whom I file pleadings in courts.
7. White index cards of my contacts accumulated over more than 15 years
8. Contact information of family, friends and news media. These were in an index box clearly labeled as such.
9. \$2710 or more in checks and money orders made out to me.
10. Exhibits that I need in the promoter law suit against me in Greenville, South Carolina
11. Personal items of my wife, family and their friends including credit cards and legal papers.
12. Political literature and handouts,
13. Memory disk for my wife's digital camera, computer discs, DVD's, etc
14. Church records
15. Personal possessions including pictures of me, my family and others.
16. Miscellaneous movies, CD's, DVD's, and audio tapes
17. Newspaper articles, letters to me, miscellaneous documents, reference material
18. Numerous other items and materials

Please send me list of the items that you have not returned. You might as well file it with the District Court. This letter is merely a draft of my pleading to be filed with the court. Why don't you save the government a lot of money by returning the remaining items that meet the criteria of the Judge's order?

Did you keep one copy of each book, video or pamphlet? I assume a sample issue of each item could be related to some investigations. Just let me know what you kept. I picked up seventy boxes of material at your FBI office in Asheville on Tuesday, September 4, 2007.

Enclosed is a facsimile of a US Dollar used as a political track by some political organization to call attention to their ideas. This attention grabbing flyer has the website and addresses of the people who published and distributed this tract. Please go arrest those folks.
