Re: USA vs. 515 Concord Ave (Robert Clarkson), Docket # 8:07-cr-0536 Returned

Dear Agent Andy:

I stopped by your office yesterday at 2pm to pick up the items that Ms. Rose said that you would return to me in her pleading dated February 11, 2008. She said that you would return to me all of my cash money, all of my checks, all of my silver & gold coins. Based upon her assurance, the court issued its order denying my motion for return of property.

Some of the items that she promised me last month were given to me almost a month later. I received a letter three weeks ago from your superior James Russell. His letter stated that you would not return to me my certain silver rounds called Liberty Dollars. This letter came after the Assistant US Attorney told the Judge that you would return these coins to me.

We have found approximately a thousand private businesses, religious/political organizations and local governments that issue private mint coins along with their own paper currency. About a third of these printed pieces of paper are labeled "dollar". If you go to Disneyland, you will exchange your FRN's for "Disney Dollars". You will see on my website approximately 300 business, political organizations and municipalities that issue warehouse receipts called "dollars"

If you arrest all the people for using pieces of paper or metal with the word "dollar" on it, you and your crew will be busy for a long time.

Based upon the statement of AUSA Rose, Judge Thornburg issued his orders dated February 25 and March 11, 2008. His order meant that you were to return to me all of my silver coins. But you did not return all of these silver coins to me. I consider your refusal to return everything that Ms. Rose told the Judge that you would, to be a violation to the court order.

When I met with you yesterday afternoon, you informed me verbally and in writing that you would not return to me my silver rounds which were labeled "liberty dollar".

You also did not return to me the following items:

1. My gold \$20 coin encased in plastic. This may have been an oversight on your part. This is listed on the inventory sheet and is clearly what Ms Rose said.
2. At least one other gold coin.
3. You returned to me 85 silver rounds. I think I had about 200 silver rounds in my office on the day you took everything.
4. A silver bezel with a silver Porcupine from my wife's jewelry box. The necklace with this was not taken. You returned to me the silver necklace with porcupine that was in the box with the other porcupines but I think another necklace and bezel was in that box.
5. Some money orders
6. Exactly \$2,000 in cash.

On the morning of your raid of May 3, 2007, I packed up to go to Columbia. At about 11am, I went into the cash folder and took everything. Then the postman came and gave me an envelope. This was from a friend and had exactly \$3,000 cash for silver coins. When I was opening the envelope, the cash fell on the floor and I remember this distinctly. My cash folder had exactly \$3,000 when I left the house and when your crew came in. Please return that to me.

Attached is a religious track entitled "Better than Money". You can see that religious organizations including this church in Anderson, SC, use representations of Federal Reserve Notes to attract attention and thereby evangelize. You can arrest all of the churches that use US currency to proselyte.
